

# China Will Be One Of The Philippines' Major Exporters Of Onions

Philippine Minister of Agriculture William Dahl recently said that by the middle of this month, the country will import 35,000 tons of red onions to make up for about two months of insufficient production. William Dahl said that red onions can only be imported before the middle of this month, so that they will not compete with the onion period starting next month.

William Dahl said at the press conference: "There may be a demand gap of 2 months, and the production is not enough. Therefore, we need to import, and we need to import 2 months, about 35,000 tons." He also pointed out Import licenses have been issued.

William Dahl added: "These red onions can only be imported by the middle of this month so as not to compete with the market during the main harvest period starting next month." William Dahl said that China will be one of the importers. When asked why there is a production gap, the agriculture minister said: "Red onions have historically been low-yield, which is why we need to use more new technologies to increase production."
